Supplies to bring:

Anywhere from 10 to 30 pairs of bobbins. You probably won't want that many, but you never know.

A few pairs that can be used for gimp bobbins.

Size 80 tatting cotton in one color or many colors.

Perle 8, metallic, or whatever you think you might want for gimp.

Graph paper and pencil

White-out

Pricking card

Contact paper

Divider pins

Regular pins

Scissors

And most importantly: a big smile!

PITTSBURGH FOLK FESTIVAL

September 3 and 4, 2016 Schenley Plaza

You may have noticed that the Pittsburgh Folk Festival was NOT held in May this year. Instead, we are partnering with the Pittsburgh Bicentennial program and as a result, the Festival will take place on Saturday, September 3 and Sunday, September 4 (this is Labor Day weekend) at the Schenley Tent Plaza in Oakland. This is the large green space between the Carnegie Library and University of Pittsburgh's Posvar Hall.

This will be an OUTDOOR event, with crafts and cultural displays, market vendors and kitchens, all under separate tents. Festival hours will run from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday. There will NOT be a separate day for a children's program as in past years.
