We both felt that this book had some nice projects.



My sister, Janny Morelle, and I are members of OIDFA (L'Organisation Internationale de la Dentelle au Fuseau et à l'Aiguille) founded in 1982. Janny lives in France and started learning bobbin lacemaking a few years ago. For years we dreamed about going to the biennial OIDFA Congress together. The dream was realized in 2012 when with our spouses we attended in Caen, France. Each country has a display showing laces done by its members. Last year, the USA's theme was State Flowers. I did an interpretation of Mountain Laurel, the Pennsylvania State Flower. Maria Provencher came up with the brilliant idea to create the display of flowers with the state that they represent as a background. She meticulously sewed my flower onto a green felt in the shape of Pennsylvania. The display made its way to the 2018 OIDFA Congress in Zaandam, the Netherlands, and to the 2019 IOLI Convention in Spokane Valley, Washington. This little lace flower returned safely to me just two weeks ago, thanks to Maria, one of the USA Administrative Council members for OIDFA., I'd like to share these photos with you all.



Visit to the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art

A Celebration of Texture and Pattern: Hooked Rugs and Historic Coverlets, is an exhibition at the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art until October 27. A special tour and talk was given by Barb Carroll, artist, curator and teacher. The group attending included fiber artists from various mediums including the Pittsburgh Lacemakers Group. Dewi Wong and Sandy Faulk were in attendance.



Ms. Carroll, who teaches rug hooking, talked about this exhibit which included works designed by her and executed by her students and herself. Ms. Carroll explained how she takes a component from an early American coverlet and applies it to a hooked rug. Her students are encouraged to use colors normally associated with early American coverlets. If a student has particularly strong feelings toward specific colors, she will work with them to complete a successful rug. Some of the pieces hung illustrate her influence in color work by Dale Chihuly.

The museum is small but is part of a network of small fiber museums at several locations in central Pennsylvania. One of the goals of the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art is to advance and make accessible early American art. They have a large collection of early American coverlets which are on display at their various locations. Visit www.sama-art.org for more information.
