WHY I.O.L.I. IS IMPORTANT By Amy Gibbons

The International Organization of Lace – for those who don't recognize the initials -- is a global society of lacemakers. There are many advantages to being a member of IOLI. As a part of a larger organization, you have more exposure to the world than just being one little lonely lacemaker. The Membership Directory allows you to find friends who may live near you who are also lacemakers and encourages others to become lacemakers. When I demonstrate, I bring my Directory along to help people from different areas find a lacemaker near where they live. The directory shows that there are lacemakers everywhere.

By joining IOLI, you gain several things. The quarterly IOLI *Bulletin* features pictures and articles about lace, and a schedule of future events at museums and workshops. IOLI provides online monthly lectures from various museums and private collections. Virtual classes with teachers of several kinds of lace are easy to sign up for. IOLI can provide to any member group a lace study box for the cost of postage and insurance. This can be used for group instruction or can become a program open to the public. IOLI also makes available a library of lace-related magazines and books that can be borrowed by any member for three weeks. Finally, the IOLI Annual Convention offers a chance to meet lacemakers and teachers from around the world. In addition to classes with new and different teachers, it is impossible to name all the wonderful things that happen there. The speakers, displays, and food are amazing.

These are some of the reasons you might want to become a part of IOLI and only some of the reasons that I joined.
