BRUGES & BEDS WORKSHOP WITH ELIZABETH PETERSON October 18-20, 2024 – Yagel Room Churchill Borough Building - 2300 William Penn Hwy., Pittsburgh, PA 15235

This fall, the PLG will host lace teacher Elizabeth Peterson for a three-day workshop on October 18-20, 2024. Elizabeth has been teaching since 1995; some of the laces she teaches include Torchon, Beds, Bucks, Bruges, Russian, Flanders and Binche. She has studied Bedfordshire extensively with Christine Springett for several years. In addition, she has won several awards for her lace at the local, state, and international levels.

The two types of lace chosen for this workshop are Beds and Bruges.. Some pictures of Beds and Bruges patterns that she has taught at her workshops are below.

The workshop will, as always, be held in the Yagel Room at the Churchill Borough Building, 2300 William Penn Hwy, Pittsburgh, PA 15235. It will consist of three 6-hour sessions, starting promptly at 10AM each day – Friday through Sunday-- and ending at 5PM, with an hour for lunch. Please bring your own lunch and drink.

Cost for the workshop is \$150 for members and \$170 for non-members.
